TOUR OVERVIEW

Namibia is a diverse country with a range of habitats from desert to semi-desert and savannah and the landscapes are truly spectacular. In many places animals still roam freely unrestricted by human influence. Home to 650 bird species and 80 large mammal species, of which, 14 birds and 15 mammals are almost entirely endemic to the country. Botswana is one of Africa's most stable and sparsely populated countries. It protects some of Africa's largest areas of wilderness and safari-based tourism is of a very high quality. You will begin in Namibia and experience the Kalahari Desert and the Sossusvlei sand dunes. It's impossible not to marvel at the diversity of life present in such hostile environments. Arguably, the jewel in Namibia's Crown is Etosha National Park famed for its huge saltpan. Its edges give way to a surprising variety of vegetation and a series of waterholes provide visitors with close up views of wildlife, particularly at night when they are floodlit. From Windhoek, you will fly to the majestic Victoria Falls for a couple of nights so that you can walk along the rim and gaze in wonder at the Falls and the Zambezi rapids far below. Saving the best for last, travel to Botswana. First to Chobe National Park, home to large herds of elephants. You will stay alongside the Zambesi River and your safaris will be by boat and also further into the park in 4 wheel drive vehicles. A short flight transports you deep into the Okavango, a lush and watery mosaic of channels and islands. You will be taken to your luxurious tented camp. Floating peacefully in a small boat, you are sure to get close to a range of animals and it is a dream destination for bird-watchers. The beauty and ever changing landscapes on this tour will be sure to delight. These two countries offer some of Africa's best wildlife viewing.

Wednesday 5 June 2024 Auckland –Sydney

Meals: In flight

Flight: 3 hours, 40 minutes

Overnight: Sydney

Depart Auckland for Sydney, arriving late afternoon. Stay overnight at an airport hotel as we have an early start the next morning. Vivid Sydney will be on while you are in town so If you feel like stretching your legs you could head into Sydney Harbour to take in the amazing light shows and installations with your tour manager this evening.

Thursday 6 June Sydney - Johannesburg

Meals: B/In flight Flight: 14 hours

Overnight: Johannesburg

You will take a morning flight from Sydney, arriving in Johannesburg late afternoon. Tonight you stay at a Johannesburg Airport Hotel.

Friday 7 June Johannesburg - Windhoek -Sossusvlei

Meals: B/D Flight: 2 hours Coach: 5 hours

Overnight: Sossusvlei

Depart Johannesburg on an early flight to Windhoek and transfer into the Namib-Naukluft National Park. Your lodge is situated close to Sossusvlei, the oldest desert in the world. This photogenic area is famous for its large red sand dunes which are some of the tallest sand dunes in the world. They're dynamic and change shape with the wind. Stay here for two nights.

Saturday 8 June Sossusvlei

Meals: B/D

Overnight: Sossusvlei

Today you have an early start and witness first light and shadows on the sand dunes before arriving at the heart of the famous sand dune sea of Namibia. Watch the colours change on the sand dunes in this spectacular and unique area. You can climb a dune close to Sossusvlei then walk to Dead Vlei with its large expanse of bleached cracked clay and skeletal camel thorn trees scattered around, contrasting with a backdrop of huge orange-red dunes that make for superb photographic opportunities. Then explore the famous Sesriem Canyon, one of the few places with permanent water before returning to your hotel for dinner.

Sunday 9 June Sossusvlei - Swakopmund

Meals: B

Coach: 4 hours

Overnight: Swakopmund

Drive to Swakopmund on the Skeleton Coast to stay two nights. Relax and enjoy this coastal town nestled between the Namib Desert and the Atlantic Ocean. There are many activities to choose from (at additional cost): desert tours and boat cruises, or perhaps just relax and enjoy the facilities at your hotel.

Monday 10 June Swakopmund

Meals: B

Overnight: Swakopmund

A day to enjoy this town and the excellent sightseeing it has to offer. Perhaps visit the aquarium, the Crystal Gallery where the world's largest-known crystal cluster is housed or Woermann House with its elegant panelled walls and stucco ceilings. There are also many art shops throughout the town centre should some 'retail therapy' be on the agenda.

Tuesday 11 June Swakopmund - Twyfelfontein

Meals: B/D Coach: 5 hours

Overnight: Twyfelfontein

You leave after an early breakfast and head north along the Skeleton Coast seeing the gravel plains and desert opening up around you with the ocean crashing down onto the shore. Visit the seal colony at Cape Cross and take in the noise (and smell!) of this large colony of Cape Fur Seals. Turning inland, you drive past Brandberg, the highest point in Namibia and a huge massif rising up over the plains. The Twyfelfontein area, a very vulnerable and delicate ecosystem, is renowned for some of the best examples of Rock Paintings and Engravings in Southern Africa. Interesting rock formations and the remainder of prehistoric volcanic action can be seen in the Organ Pipes and Burnt Mountain, among the most prominent geographic features. Your lodge accommodation for two nights is set amongst a mountainous backdrop and is close to the rock paintings.

Wednesday 12 June Twfelfontein

Meals: B/D

Overnight: Twyfelfontein

Take a guided nature walk or relax beside the swimming pool and take in the beautiful surroundings. Spectacular rock formations bear witness to volcanic activity and geological events of prehistoric times. Those interested in geology may wish to visit to the Organ Pipes, Burnt Mountain, Doros Crater and Petrified Forest. Visit the Living Culture Museum of the Damara people and then have some free time at leisure in the afternoon

Thursday 13 June Twyfelfontein - Etosha National Park

Meals: B

Coach: 4 hours Overnight: Etosha Travel north to Etosha National Park, considered the jewel in Namibia's crown. The park's main characteristic is a salt pan that covers 4700 square kilometres, so large that it can be seen from space. There is abundant wildlife which congregates around the waterholes giving almost guaranteed sightings of animals and birds. The Okaukuejo rest-camp overlooks a permanent waterhole, which is floodlit at night and this is where you will see the wildlife gathering and interacting. The spectacle starts at dawn, with animals coming to quench their thirst and continues throughout the day and into the night when, in the early evening, it is not uncommon to have black rhinoceros, elephant and lion, all drinking at the same time. Stay for two nights to enjoy the many facilities of this remote desert oasis.





Friday 14 June Etosha National Park

Meals: B

Overnight: Etosha

At Okaukuejo Lodge you will visit many waterholes as you traverse the park. Etosha is home to many species of game including lion, leopard, cheetah, elephant, hyena, giraffe as well as antelope and over 340 species of birds so there is something for every animal and bird lover. This park is recognised as one of the best game parks in Southern Africa for the numbers and various species of game as well as the interesting geology

Saturday 15 June Etosha National Park – Windhoek

Meals: B/D

Coach: 4 hours

Overnight: Windhoek

Travel back to the city for your last night in Namibia. The journey takes you through the small historic town of Okahandja, home of a large wood carving market. You will have a city tour of Windhoek before settling into your hotel for the evening.

Sunday 16 June Windhoek – Victoria Falls

Meals: B

Flight: 1 hour 35 minutes Overnight: Victoria Falls Hop on a morning flight from Windhoek to Victoria Falls, locally known as Mosi-oa-Tunya, 'the smoke that thunders'. Tons of water plunges over a chasm that is nearly 2km wide, falling about 100 metres to the Zambesi River below. The thunderous sound of the water being heard for miles around. You will have a sunset cruise on the Zambesi River this evening and then an evening at the grand Victoria Falls Hotel.

Monday 17 June Victoria falls - Chobe Safari Lodge

Meals: B

Drive: 1 hour 30 minutes Overnight: Chobe National Park Take a guided tour of Victoria Falls and then drive to your lodge in Chobe National Park; the lodge is situated in the heart of the park, overlooking the Chobe River and the Caprivi flood-plains. The park has great diversity of wildlife, and is home to the largest concentration of elephants in Africa. Your days at the lodge include safari activities - game drives, game viewing by small boats, sunset cruises along the Chobe River, and after-dinner stargazing.





Tuesday 18 June Chobe National Park

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Chobe National Park

Your lodge offers a choice of land or water-based activities and the most complete game experience in the Chobe National Park. Early morning and late afternoon game drives are conducted by expert guides in open-sided 4x4 vehicles to ensure maximum visibility of the spectacular scenery and abundant wildlife. Meanwhile, riverside game viewing is done from small and highly manoeuvrable boats, perfect for morning or sunset cruises. Chobe's diverse wildlife roams in abundance – it is home to the largest concentration of elephant in Africa. During the dry season these large herds, as well as vast herds of buffalo, congregate on the fertile flood plains along the Chobe River to drink, bathe and play. There are frequent sightings of lion, African wild dog, puku, red lechwe, sable, giraffe and roan antelope.

Wednesday 19 June Chobe National Park

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Chobe National Park

Another full day in Chobe National Park with animal viewing by small boats and game drives.

Thursday 20 June Chobe National Park – Moremi Game Reserve

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Moremi Game

Reserve

Take a charter flight from Chobe to Moremi and transfer to the Moremi Game Reserve. The lodge offers a broad range of safari activities on both land and water. Exhilarating game drives provide the chance to track wildlife in the beautiful surrounds of the reserve, a protected area renowned for frequent sightings of lion, leopard and cheetah. African wild dog sightings are also regularly reported. Water activities involve the exploration of the water-lily fringed Xakanaxa Lagoon and surrounding Okavango Delta channels by motor boat and mokoro canoe. The birdlife is prolific and varied, and each boat trip offers you exceptional bird-watching opportunities.





Friday 21 June and Saturday 22 June Moremi Game Reserve

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Moremi Game

Reserve

A full day of activities, in Moremi Game Reserve. Options may include game drives, boat rides plus:

Mokoro Excursions

Become part of bustling river life by easing between the papyrus clad banks on traditional 'mokoro' canoes. These are propelled from the stern by skilled 'poler' guides, allowing you to sit back and absorb the scenery.

Walking Safaris

Explore the wilderness on foot with your own personal guide.

Motorboat Sunset Cruises

Enjoy an African sunset while drifting on a lagoon in the middle of the Okavango Delta. Watch as changing colours are reflected in the smooth waters, disturbed only by dipping swallows or curious hippos. (subject to delta water levels)
