TOUR OVERVIEW

Journey in comfort on a modern, purpose-built polar expedition ship to a continent considered by many to be the ultimate travel destination, where wildlife is prolific and the scenery is staggeringly beautiful. Your adventure begins with two nights in Argentina exploring the grand and vibrant capital city of Buenos Aires. Then fly south to Ushuaia in Tierra del Fuego, the world's southernmost city, to board your ship and begin your Antarctic adventure. You will sail through Beagle Channel and across Drake Passage, a major shipping route around Cape Horn for centuries before the Panamá canal was built.

En route to Antarctica, you will have time to spot wildlife from the indoor/outdoor observation deck, learn more about the biology, history, and geology of the area from experts, or simply relax and enjoy the fine facilities on board.

After time at sea, you will be in Antarctica to begin five enthralling days exploring the shores of the frozen continent. You will go ashore in small groups with expert guides, getting up close to penguins and other wildlife. You will travel in Zodiacs close to massive icebergs and dramatic everchanging landscapes. A fleet of underwater drones will reveal what's below the ocean surface.

From the ship, you might see whales as they begin to arrive in greater numbers. You may even have the opportunity to go kayaking among the icebergs. Back on board, specialists will continue their lectures to help you gain insights into this magical place, and you can carry on enjoying the five-star facilities. Come aboard for one of the most memorable experiences of your life.

IS THIS TOUR FOR ME?

You will need to be in good health and fit enough to enjoy comfortably-paced walks on uneven and slippery terrain. On the cruise the activity level can be as intense or relaxed as you are comfortable with, as it is always your choice whether to participate in the activities or just relax on board. You must be able to get on board the small boats (Zodiacs) to cruise around or go on shore. The Southern Ocean can be rough at times.

If the Antarctic tour is for you, then you'll enjoy the pre-tour extension. The walking tours comprise about 3 hours of walking, sometimes on cobbled streets, and some standing, but that's about the extent of the exertion.

During the two-day crossing through the Beagle Channel and across the Drake Passage and towards Antarctica, the expedition team will equip you with all you need to make the most of your polar expedition.

Visit the onboard science centre and find out what lies ahead. Listen to experts talk with knowledge and passion about Antarctica's history, the science beneath the ice, and the impact of climate change and plastic pollution. You'll learn how to make your visit as safe and as low-impact as possible, and about the citizen science projects you can take part in.

There's plenty of time to relax — whether on the deck, in the spa or at the gym, and you can enjoy some delicious cuisine and meet fellow travellers in the Explorer lounge and bar.

Every expedition cruise to Antarctica is unique. All routes and excursions are provisional and subject to change as weather, sea or ice conditions may affect the itinerary. Rest assured the ship's crew will work hard to get the most out of your visit.



OPTIONAL PRE-TOUR EXTENSION

There will be an optional pre-tour extension in Chile, which we encourage you to consider. This stopover will break what is otherwise a long journey to Buenos Aires and help you deal with jetlag before the Antarctic cruise. You will have more time to get to know your fellow group members before joining the ship, and of course you will get to see more of the fascinating continent of South America.

You will stay two nights in the coastal city of Vina del Mar and one night in the Chilean capital Santiago. You will enjoy a day touring both Vina del Mar and the colourful, spontaneous, and edgy port city of Valparaiso.

See something of Chile's traditional countryside in the fertile Aconcagua Valley, home to some of Chile's more productive vineyards. There's also the opportunity to look at alpaca farms and learn something of the wars against Spanish rule in the 19th century, lead by a revolutionary with the improbable name of Bernardo O'Higgins. Finish up with a morning exploring the capital Santiago, nestled between the Andes and the coastal cordillera.

On a day trip to the Aconcagua Valley you'll visit wineries, an alpaca farm and places that are significant in Chile's rich history of the independence wars of the 19th century. There will be opportunities to sample Chilean cuisine, and taste the excellent wines of course.

YOUR SHIP

You will be cruising to and at Antarctica on the operator Hurtigruten's newest ship, the *Fridtjof Nansen*. Launched in 2020, this custom-built polar ship is a luxury experience in its own right. All the spacious cabins are on the outside of the ship and have either a window (rather than a porthole) or a sliding door to a private balcony (additional charge applies).

The ship has an elegant lounge and bar, three restaurants, library, science centre and an indoor/outdoor observation deck. Other facilities on board include a large gym and wellness centre, library, sauna, infinity pool and hot tubs. There is a medical centre staffed by an English-speaking doctor and nurse. All meals, soft drinks, beer and house wine are included, along with free wifi.

The crew includes a team of Antarctic specialists and modern-day explorers. Highly experienced, passionate and knowledgeable, they will escort you on small boats and shore expeditions, and give lectures and hands-on citizen-science workshops on board the ship. A fleet of underwater drones will give you a good look at what's happening below the ocean surface.

SUSTAINABILITY

The *Fridtjof Nansen* is packed with ground-breaking green technology such as battery packs, heat recovery systems and a cutting-edge hull design. These innovations combine to reduce carbon emissions by more than 20% compared with other cruise ships of the same size.

Hurtigruten stopped using heavy fuel oil more than a decade ago and campaigns for its worldwide ban. To set a new standard, it is also considering a range of new, green fuel options including biofuels made from organic waste. The company aims to be the most sustainable tourism operator in the world, and push the industry's boundaries on ESG (environmental, social and governance indicators).

By travelling on this ship you are also supporting the Hurtigruten Foundation, which works to fight climate change, strengthen local communities in areas where the company works and stop unsustainable mass tourism.
