At the end of your cruise, disembark and spend two nights in the wonderful Frenchinfluenced city of Vientiane.

Meals: in flight Overnight: Singapore Depart Auckland in the afternoon on a direct flight to Singapore on Singapore Airlines. Arrive in the late evening and transfer to your hotel for the next two nights.

## **Sunday 29 September Singapore**

Enjoy a full day in Singapore. Activities will be arranged based on the group's interests. Options include a half day at 'Gardens by the Bay' with visits to a couple of the incredible domes holding indoor waterfalls, exotic plants, and unique habitats. Or perhaps explore Chinatown and the Singapore Botanic Gardens. If you fancy a bit of exercise, a bike ride on the new Singapore Rail Corridor may be of interest. ## Monday 30 September Chiang Mai

Meals: B/D Flight: 3 hours

Overnight: Chiang Mai

Have a relaxing morning in Singapore and then in the afternoon fly to Chiang Mai. Tonight you will have dinner with the group and have time to explore the lively night markets.

## Tuesday 1 October Chiang Mai

Meals: B

Overnight: Chiang Mai

Take a tour around a local hill tribe village nestled in lush countryside and learn about the local culture and way of life.



## Wednesday 2 October Golden triangle

Meals: B/L/D Transfer: 6 hours

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Transfer from your hotel in Chiang Mai to the boarding spot for the river ship. This will be a fairly long drive but with stops at Ban Rai Sabaidee Farm for lunch plus a guided visit to the Golden Triangle and the now infamous opium museum. Embark your ship by 16.00 and enjoy welcome drinks on the sundeck with traditional Thai dancing.

## Thursday 3 October Into Laos

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Pass through immigration formalities at the Thai/Laos border and re-join the ship. Set sail downstream on the beautiful Upper Mekong River and take in a presentation on the Lao language. After lunch, if time allows, sightseeing on foot in Pak Sith.

## Friday 4 October Pak Beng Elephant Sanctuary

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Take a morning walk at the local Ban Luang Tong Lao Lowland village. Laos is known as 'The land of a million elephants'. After lunch, you will visit a rescue sanctuary that is helping to preserve the elephants of Laos and provide sustainable alternative employment for Mahouts who once trained and rode these beautiful creatures. In the evening you moor at a sandbank for a special riverside barbecue and cocktail party. Light paper lanterns with the crew and enjoy a dance in remote Laos.

## Saturday 5 October Ban Bor and Yoi Hai Khmu villages

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Today you will discover the Khmu minority group and learn about their remote way of life. In the morning you will visit Ban Bor village, home to the Lao and Khummu people. In the afternoon you walk through the Khummu village of Yoi Haoi and will have the opportunity to support locally produced handicrafts.





## Sunday 6 October Pak Ou Caves

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Continue cruising downstream to Pak Ou, sightseeing by local boat and exploring the unique Pak Ou Caves, a Buddhist sanctuary with spectacular limestone cliff faces. See the production of local Laos whisky at the Whisky village and shop for locally produced handicrafts before sailing into the World Heritage City of Luang Prabang. Moor overnight in central Luang Prabang.

# Monday 7 October Luang Prabang crafts & culture

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Today you can explore the various handicrafts of Laos in more detail. Start with a morning walk up the 228 steps to Phousi temple where the best views of Luang Prabang can be found. After lunch aboard the ship, you will visit Ock Pop Tok, a social enterprise providing sustainable employment and training for the women of local weaving villages. You then head to TAEC (Traditional Arts and Ethnology Centre) to understand more about Laos musical instruments. Cocktail hour is accompanied by a traditional Bacci ceremony onboard highlighting some of the instruments seen in the afternoon.

## Tuesday 8 October Luang Prabang

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Take an early morning walking tour to observe the morning alms offering by local people to the hundreds of monks who walk around the city every morning. You continue after breakfast to the morning market before taking tuk-tuks for a city tour of this well-preserved and unique UNESCO World Heritage site with its many Buddhist temples, libraries, and royal palace. The afternoon is free to explore the beauty and unique atmosphere of Luang Prabang.

## Wednesday 9 October Kaung Si Waterfall

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

After breakfast sail downstream to Ban Chan where you can take part in a pottery demonstration at the local pottery workshop. After Lunch, moor at Ban Mouang Khai and take a short drive to see the deep jungle pools at the Khaung Si Waterfall where you can swim in the crystal-clear waters. You then stop at the Laos Buffalo Farm, a social enterprise utilizing the abundant buffalo in Laos before rejoining the ship. Sail downstream for a sunset cruise and moor overnight at Ban Na San.



## Thursday 10 October Xayabouri Dam

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Morning walk through Ban Na San Hmong Village. In the afternoon visit Xayabouri Hydroelectric Dam and take an inside look at the workings of this somewhat controversial project as we pass through the locks. Afternoon walk at Ban Khok Fark and moor overnight.

## Friday 11 October Ban Pak Yun to Pak Lay

Meals: B/L/D

Overnight: Pandaw rivership

Explore the Ban Pak Yun mixed minorities tribe in the morning, (a rural local village) before setting sail to Pak Lay, your final destination on the river cruise. Enjoy a tour of your Pandaw ship and fruit carving demonstration on the sundeck in the afternoon before farewell cocktails and dinner in the evening.

## Saturday 12 October Vientiane

Meals: B/L

Overnight: Vientiane

Disembark the Pandaw ship in the morning and take a long-tail boat expedition downstream to Vientiane. Lunch and drinks will be provided on the long-tail boat by your Pandaw chef and bar staff. Arrive into Vientiane around 17:30 and check in to your hotel for the next two nights.

## Sunday 13 October Vientiane

Meals: B

Overnight: Vientiane

Meet your local guide for a full-day city tour exploring Laos' French colonial capital. Visit Talaat Sao - Vientiane's Morning Market, Wat Sisaket, Haw Phra Kaew, and Putousay, the victory gate inspired by the Arc de triomphe in Paris. After lunch at a local restaurant, head out of town to visit one of Laos' slightly stranger attractions - Xieng Khuan Buddha Park. A sculpture park with over 200 Hindu and Buddhist statues.

## Monday 14 October Ventiane

Meals: B/D

Overnight: Vientiane

A free day in Vientiane and then enjoy a farewell dinner with the group this evening.

## Tuesday 15 October Homebound

Meals: B

Overnight: in flight

In the late morning, you will be transferred to the airport for your onward flight from Vientiane back to Auckland via Singapore. Arrive in New Zealand on Wednesday 16 October.

You may wish to stay in Southeast Asia longer, perhaps adding a visit to Cambodia or Vietnam. The Calder & Lawson Tours team can assist you with any post-tour arrangements.
